We hope you all had a wonderful summer break and enjoyed some time together. It has been so lovely welcoming everyone back through our doors and seeing the children settle back into the rhythm of nursery life with such excitement.

This term is already filled with adventure, curiosity, and lots of seasonal learning. Here's a little glimpse into what the children have been exploring so far:

The Nest

Our youngest children have been busy discovering the world around them in hands-on, playful ways. Recently they have:

- Gone on a tractor hunt - sparking lots of pointing, laughter, and language-building moments.
- Explored autumn resources like leaves, conkers, and pinecones — perfect for little hands to feel and investigate.
 - Set off on an autumn walk to notice the changes in the world around them.
 - Enjoyed time in the garden, building confidence in moving, climbing, and balancing.
 - Practiced tipping and pouring, developing early math's and fine motor skills.
- Painted on a large scale, giving children space to express themselves with big movements and bold colours.

Fledglings

Our older children have embraced independence and teamwork in their play and projects. They have:

- Helped make banana bread and banana & oat balls for snack - a delicious way to practice measuring, mixing, and patience.
 - Stepped into nature with an autumn walk, noticing colours, textures, and seasonal treasures.
 - Explored the outdoors with curiosity and confidence.
- Joined in making their own playdough, taking pride in creating something they could use in play.
- Begun exploring our core books, with The Gruffalo quickly becoming a firm favourite for story time and role play.

Apple Adventures

A huge thank you to Glyn, who visited to show the children how apples are pressed into juice. Every child was able to watch the process and taste the freshly pressed juice — such a memorable experience.

Following this, we have woven apples into many areas of learning:

- Apple printing - exploring patterns and mark-making.
- Building with apples and cocktail sticks — problem-solving, balancing, and lots of giggles when towers toppled.
 - Apple crumble - measuring, stirring, and sharing the results together.
 - Apple threading - working on focus, fine motor skills, and perseverance.
- Apple-scented cloud dough - a rich sensory experience sparking imaginative play.

Speech and Language Development: Information for Parents

Children develop speech, language, and communication skills at different rates, and it's completely normal for there to be variation. However, understanding the typical milestones for your child's age can help you feel confident about their development - or know when to seek a bit of extra support.

We recommend visiting the Speech and Language UK website, where you can find helpful information about what to expect from birth to 5 years, as well as complete a free online progress check. This quick tool allows you to assess your child's communication skills and will give clear guidance on what to do next if there are any concerns.
