

The Early Bird Pre-School Strathmore latest news . . .

All the children in the setting have been particularly fascinated by the eggs in the incubator, discussing how the eggs needed to stay warm until they hatched—a process that can take up to 28 days! Each day, the children eagerly checked for any signs of ducklings starting to peck their way out of their shells. Once the ducklings hatched, we examined the eggshells closely and talked about the yolk inside, which provides the energy the ducklings need to use their egg tooth to break free from the shell. After hatching, the ducklings were moved into their 'brooding pen' under a warm lamp. The children especially enjoyed watching them each day as they pecked at their food, drank water, and cuddled up together to sleep. During the session, the children had the chance to watch the ducklings take a swim in the paddling pool. They were delighted by the splashing and diving, watching with fascination as the ducklings explored the water!

Fledglings adventures last month:

Following on from our ducklings experience we have introduced caterpillars that the children have been observing and patiently waiting for them to cocoon and turn into butterflies. The fledglings have shown such an interest in animals recently that Charlotte bought her dog in for another visit – throwing balls and play fetch!

The children have also loved exploring our newly developed mud kitchen. They have been using flowers, water, mud and other natural resources to support their learning and interests. Lots of the Fledglings children have also been building, constructing and problem solving with loose parts such as hoses, working together they have been using these to transport water in the garden.

The Nest's adventures last month:

This past month the children in the nest have been exploring their new garden area. They have enjoyed painting on the fence with water and exploring on their ride on toys, developing their gross motor skills.

They have also been getting messy this term, exploring rice play, crazy foam, sand and gloop.

This month the children have been working on their core songs and have shown a big interest in our music box, with various objects for reference.

This half term the children have been also developing their health and hygiene skills. Using the new sink to practice washing their hands before meal times and faces after mealtimes.

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Tip of the Half Term - Nurturing School Readiness

As lots of our children are about to embark on an exciting journey into school, we want to ensure they have enough tools in their tool box to thrive.

To be school ready children DO NOT NEED to:

- Read
- Write
- Be proficient in mathematics.



They will learn this at school!

To be school ready, most children NEED to be able to:

- Be independent in meeting some of their self care needs. For example, put their coat, shoes, jumpers and trousers on, wash their hands, wipe their nose.
- Communicate their needs, for example be able to ask for help when needed or when they need the toilet.
- Listen to and follow instructions.
- Sit at a table to eat lunch/snack.
- Begin to show resilience and a 'have a go' attitude.
- Take turns and share with others.

How you can nurture these skills at home through the POWER OF PLAY:

- Story telling- read to your child daily and have conversations about the story and its illustrations.
- Simple games such as 'simon says' or turn taking building a tower. Introduce to rules and expectations and encourage turn taking.
- Give them time to try to overcome challenges and problem solve in their play, for example use phrases such as 'let's think of a different way' or 'what should we do next time'.
- Set up a tea party - have your guests washed their hands? Do they need help pouring their drink?

We are doing all this and more to ensure the transition into school is a smooth as possible for your child. We are also inviting your child's new school teacher into Early Birds to visit and their key person will share all the amazing things your child can do.

If you have any questions, concerns or something you want us to focus on to support your child's journey into school, please speak to your key person.
