Fledgling News:

The children have had a fantastic time creating their own treasure maps, which led to some exciting group treasure hunts around the garden. It's been lovely to see them working together—giving each other directions, using rich positional language, and helping one another find where 'X marks the spot.' We've especially enjoyed watching their conversations grow, as they listened to each other and shared ideas during their adventures. The children have continued to show a wonderful curiosity about the world around them, particularly when using binoculars and magnifying glasses to take a closer look. This summer term, they have explored all that nature has to offer. A highlight was discovering ladybird larvae in the garden. We had the chance to observe them closely as they grew, formed cocoons, and eventually emerged as ladybirds. It's been a joy to hear them using their newly learned vocabulary during daily activities, often excitedly noticing and commenting on any changes they have observed on a daily basis. The children have enjoyed going on bug hunts around the garden. A particularly special highlight has been seeing some children who were initially fearful of bugs grow in confidence — they're now happily picking them up, holding them, and watching as they crawl across their hands and arms. Along the way, we even discovered a few insect species that were new to us!



We've welcomed a new resident pet, Barry the African Land Snail, and the children have absolutely fallen in love with him. They enjoy watching him munch on vegetables, and some have even braved holding him.

We've been busy with lots of fun activities that help strengthen the children's fine motor skills. The children have been interested in the letters that make up their name and practicing forming these letters using large chalks, pens and paints. They have also been practicing their scissor skills, which we have seen massive progress in. All Key People have completed transition reports for the children who are leaving, and end-of-term reports for those who are staying. It's been wonderful to reflect on how much progress each child has made and to see just how far they've come across all areas of development



Nest News:

This term, we have welcomed new starters into the Nest Room and have been delighted with how well they have settled in. Our Nest children have enjoyed exploring a variety of textures and creating patterns through activities such as manipulating playdough and participating in a large group handprint painting. They have also shown curiosity in learning about animals, closely observing the differences between those with shells and those without.



Their love for stories and books continues to grow, enriching their language development. With the lovely weather we've experienced, the children have enjoyed staying cool through a range of water play activities. We've observed their fascination with cause and effect as they tip and pour water using different containers.
