We have loved welcoming under 2's in our nest room for the very first time. The children have settled amazingly and you, the parents have been great in supporting us. The children have enjoyed invitations to play that have been set up, following their new and expanding interests. This has helped them to feel comfortable and secure during their session. We have spent time outdoors, both in the garden and going for walks exploring nature and the change in seasons. As we approach the build up to Christmas the children will be exploring lots of sensory activities, with the use of lights, a variety of colours, glitter, shaving foam and much more. We are very much looking forward to the second part of the Autumn term and if you ever want a chat about your child's/children's learning or development please don't hesitate to send us a message on tapestry, give us a call or ask us at the door and we can arrange a suitable time to meet.

Fledgling Room

There are so many learning opportunities during the Autumn term. The children have been able to observe seasonal change out in the local community as we have explored local parks, the community orchard and the allotments. It has been amazing to witness the wonder and awe of the children as they have harvested and prepared their own fruit and vegetables for snack, which in turn has meant the children have been more willing to try new tastes for example, pumpkin soup and puree. The children have also enjoyed collecting natural, autumn resources including, different coloured leaves and conkers. The children have engaged in lots of activities involving conkers for example, conker rolling with paint, conker and spoon races and exploring their texture and appearance using magnifying glasses. The children have used their fine motor skills to investigate pumpkins, they have hammered golf tees into them, decorated them with pens and different materials and scooped the seeds and fibrous strands out using spoons.

The children have been growing in independence over this past term. We have really focused on encouraging them to hang their coats and bags on their pegs, to try and put their shoes and coats on themselves and many of our children are attending to toileting needs independently. It has been lovely to see how proud and determined they are to learn these new skills. As we go into the new half term and during the build up to Christmas some of the seasonal and curriculum activities we will be exploring include, light and colour in line with fireworks night, going on a listening walk to Devil's Dyke to investigate nature and making and sending Christmas cards. We will also be collecting and delivering food to the food bank at St Helens Church and the children will be making their very own Christmas dinner with the vegetables they have grown and harvested.

Online Safety

Children are now more aware and have more access to the world of being online and using a range of technology to watch videos and to play games which can put them at risk of being exposed to inappropriate content. The NSPCC have an informative website which can support parents in talking to their children about online safety and have tools to make this a little less daunting, with their very own character Techosaurus. Techosaurus is aimed at young children that are starting to use the internet, it promotes the use of positive language and conversation to help children to understand how to be safe whilst enjoying the benefits of internet use. It promotes not just talking to your children about your views and what could happen but also allowing children the time and space to talk to their trusted adults about what they are playing, watching or seeing. The NSPCC website also have tools and advice in using parent controls and the importance of them, activity packs for the children and explains their four key messages in regards to

online safety. These are:

Play and be Kind Online **Protect your Personal Information** Ask before you try something new online Say if anything has made you feel upset

There is information and advice specified for different age groups including, an online safety checklist for parents and a preschool guide for parents. This will help parents to ensure the information and conversations they are having with their children regarding online use is age and stage appropriate.
